PLAN 630 (3 CREDITS) URBAN & REGIONAL PLANNING IN ASIA

Focused on Asia, with an extensive coverage of Southeast Asia, this course introduces concepts and policies regarding kev development issues fostered by rapid and haphazard urbanization developing in societies. Planning affects nearly all aspects of urban life. Major thematic areas include: 1) urban and regional development theories and patterns; 2) urban poverty and social inequalities, the quality of the urban environment, and socio-cultural lifeworlds; 3) the challenges of providing housing, infrastructure, and basic services; 4) uneven development, migration, and urban informality; and 5) the role of civil society in creating civic space and inclusionary cities.



The first half of the course, broadly, will address debates around the aforementioned themes of urban planning and development, with illustrative examples. The second half of the course will highlight regional differences and idiosyncrasies by focusing on countries and cities of Southeast, South, and East Asia.

The format will comprise lectures by the instructor and student-led seminars and discussions. Assignments will include critical position papers and a final research paper. POLS 307B
